How Dojo Scholarships work.

Dojo scholarships are used by current members of the dojo in good standing. Dojo members on scholarship will pay membership fees at a reduced rate and will have unlimited practice in classes. Scholarships are awarded on a month to month basis, which only requires a student to check in at the end of each month with the Chief Instructor or a Board Member. Students do not need to fill out an application for a scholarship, but the dojo will keep a record of the scholarship for the student. Privacy for students on scholarship will be maintained throughout the process. The Board of Directors of Two Rivers Aikikai wants to make sure that students are able to continue their practice during times of financial stress.

For Teen and Adult Members.

Membership dues for students on a full dojo scholarship are reduced to \$25 per month.* Membership dues for students on a partial scholarship will be reduced to \$50 per month.*

For Children ages 6 & 7.

Membership dues for students on a full dojo scholarship are reduced to \$10 per month.* Membership dues for students on a partial scholarship will be reduced to \$20 per month.*

For Children ages 8 to 11.

Membership dues for students on a full dojo scholarship are reduced to \$15 per month.* Membership dues for students on a partial scholarship will be reduced to \$30 per month.*

* If at any time a student on scholarship determines that they are unable to pay membership dues at the reduced rate, the dojo will privately find a sponsor to cover the reduced rate for that applicant. A student's name is not disclosed to sponsor without student's permission.

Where do the Dojo Scholarship Funds come from?

Funding for the Dojo Scholarship Fund comes from donations that members make voluntarily above their membership dues on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis. Donations to the dojo above membership dues are tax deductible since Two Rivers Aikikai is a 501(c)(3) federal non-profit organization.
